Dorothy was the perfect farm wife. When Clare was away on Charolais business, she held down the fort, looking after their children. She also spent a lot of time helping her neighbours and friends with whatever they needed.

Along with Clare, she was also a contributor to the Horticultural Society and the Foresters Club.
